Summary of Dissertation Contents	This PhD dissertation breaks new ground in two ways. By utilizing newly discovered historical materials in various government archives in Ulanbaatar, Mr. Bataa has reconstructed the history of the Japanese internees (called POWs in archival data) in Mongolia following the end of World War II. He has translated hundreds of documents from Mongolian and Russian into English to help complete his dissertation. Second, Mr. Bataa has tied the importance of the role played by the POW experience to the opening of new relationships with Japan during the Cold War. These two points make this a valuable and unique contribution to scholarship and to understanding the history of Mongolia's relationship with Japan.		
Summary of Dissertation Screening Results	The Dissertation was passed by all three members of the screening committee following revisions carried out by Mr. Bataa as he responded to the original comments by the committee members and a successful oral defense.		
Summary of Exam Result or Academic Skills	Mr. Bataa successfully completed his oral exam and the committee was unanimous that he should consider expanding the work and publishing it as a book in the near future.
